Message from the Pastor's Desk

I have been fortunate throughout my ministry in having served with deacons who cared for the church and for me. There have been a few exceptions to that but, for the most part, I have observed deacons as a caring group of believers.

My first deacons were members of Liberty Hill Baptist Church in Mt Gilead, NC. There were seven of them, Connelly, Clayton, Joe, Ira, Jesse, Jerry and Philip, my first ordination candidate. They were wonderful men. All of them were roll models for me and other young men of our church. They did not rotate. The church was able to "get away" with no rotation because each man was benevolent and caring. They did not seek preeminence in the church.

In my second pastorate I had the most gracious chairman. His name was Garrett. He was a big man physically. He often bragged that he had lost "five good men" in his lifetime. It seemed as if he was on a perpetual diet! Garrett had a big heart for God and people. He loved me as his Pastor and often called me "Dr. Graham" because I was known to preach evangelist sermons (I served as a Youth Evangelist for 3 years before becoming a Pastor.)

I have often praised God for giving me deacons that would partner with me which is certainly true at Boonville Baptist. As a Pastor, I have never nominated someone for the deaconate, nor have I voted for anyone to serve. When ballots are passed to the congregation, I simply fold my blank ballot and turn it in.

Thank God for rotation of deacons. Every deacon needs a break and every church needs fresh hearts and new ideas. As a matter of fact, rotation is good for every position in the church.

In October I encourage you to pray concerning your nominations and pray for those who receive your vote. Blessings


