Message from the Pastor's Desk

Turn with me please in your Bible to John chapter 21. My message today has to do with this entire chapter which John records as the third and final appearance of Christ to His disciples in John's Gospel.

I believe that John gives us a glimpse of what it means to have Jesus in your life. Jesus commanded His disciples to continue following Him in His first appearance. This appearance solidifies this command. Let us look at these glimpses of Christ...

First, we get a glimpse of life without Christ. Peter has stated that he is going fishing, and some follow Him. They get into the boat and cast the nets. They caught nothing.

- They were fishing in the right place (Sea of Galilee). This small sea was a mecca for fishing. The cold water coming down from the mountains lead to this sea being alive with fish.
- They were fishing at the right time (at night). This would allow their catch to be fresh for the morning market.
- They were fishing with the right companions. At least four of these men were expert fishermen who once made their living fishing.

With all the above being true, they still caught nothing. This is an excellent picture of living without Christ. They caught nothing, not even seaweed!

In this text, which is my message this Sunday morning, John gives us four glimpses of what it means to have the living Christ in your life...
